

## **The Prevent Duty June 2015**

Although at Mitcheldean Primary School the risk of radicalisation is low, staff should be aware of the concern and include in their safeguarding practice a watching eye for children who may be vulnerable to radicalisation and alert the DSL . Staff and Governors should be aware that there is a programme called Channel to which pupils who may be vulnerable to radicalisation may be referred.

Staff should also be aware of the risks posed by the internet, although SWGfL should filter out any terrorist or extremist material.

CPHSE should help teach children how to manage risky situations including developing resistance to outside pressures. Pupils should also learn about democracy, government and how laws are made and upheld as part of their work on promoting fundamental British values. Radicalisation and Extremism is not limited to one aspect of life and staff should be aware of a range of concerns that may affect the well-being of pupils such as, religion, politics, animal rights, witchcraft.
